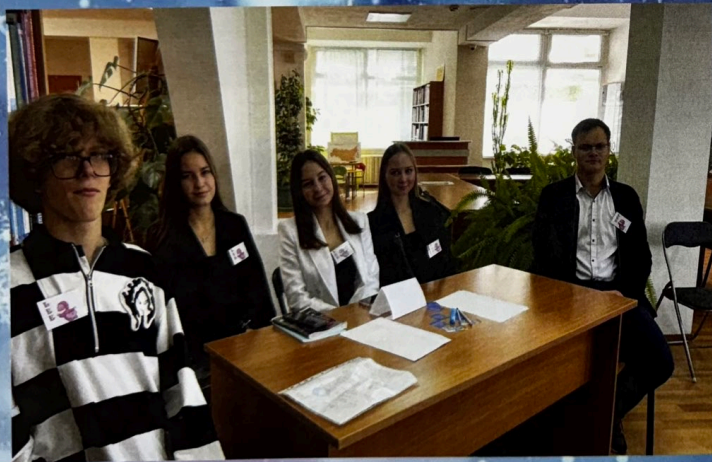


International Translation Day

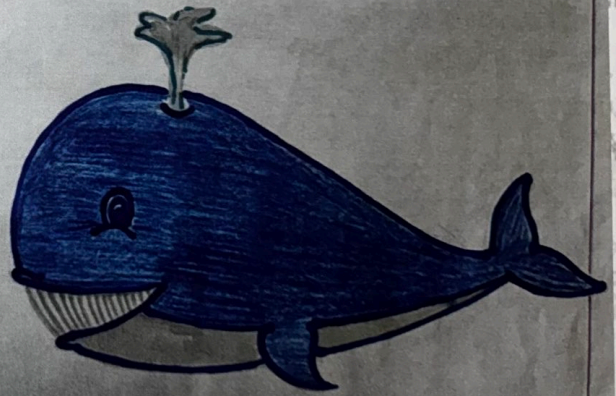
We are very small and live all together. We are very beautiful. We have got plenty of colors. We are animals, but somebody thinks that we are plants.

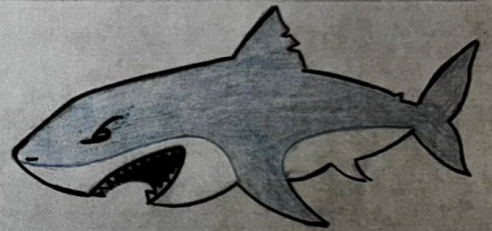

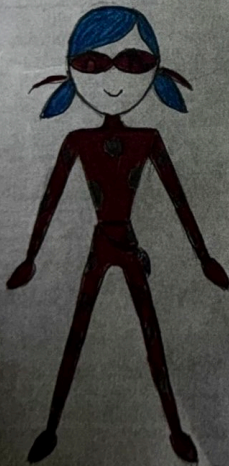

Porridge

Porridge has always had a special place in Russian cuisine. It was a common Slavic ritual dish, sacrificed to the gods of agriculture and cattle breeding and was a necessary part of wedding feast, Christmas celebration and christenings. The history of its appearance is connected with a fact that since ancient times the Slavic tribes were engaged in agriculture and grew rye, wheat, barley and millet. Initially, porridge was a liquid soup made from flour, but, later, with a spread of buckwheat, the word "kasha" began to mean mainly buckwheat porridge. Barley and oatmeal porridges have been popular since ancient times throughout Russia and were served mainly on weekdays.

Millet porridge has been known to Russians for as long as oatmeal and barley. The word millet was first mentioned in written documents in the 11th century. Millet porridge was eaten on weekdays and during festive feasts.

The most beloved and popular porridge among Russians was buckwheat porridge- already in the 17th century it was considered a national Russian dish, although it appeared quite late – in the 15th century.

Rice porridge appeared in the 18th century, when rice was brought to Russia and was consumed mainly in cities.

Nowadays, porridge is very popular breakfast in our country.

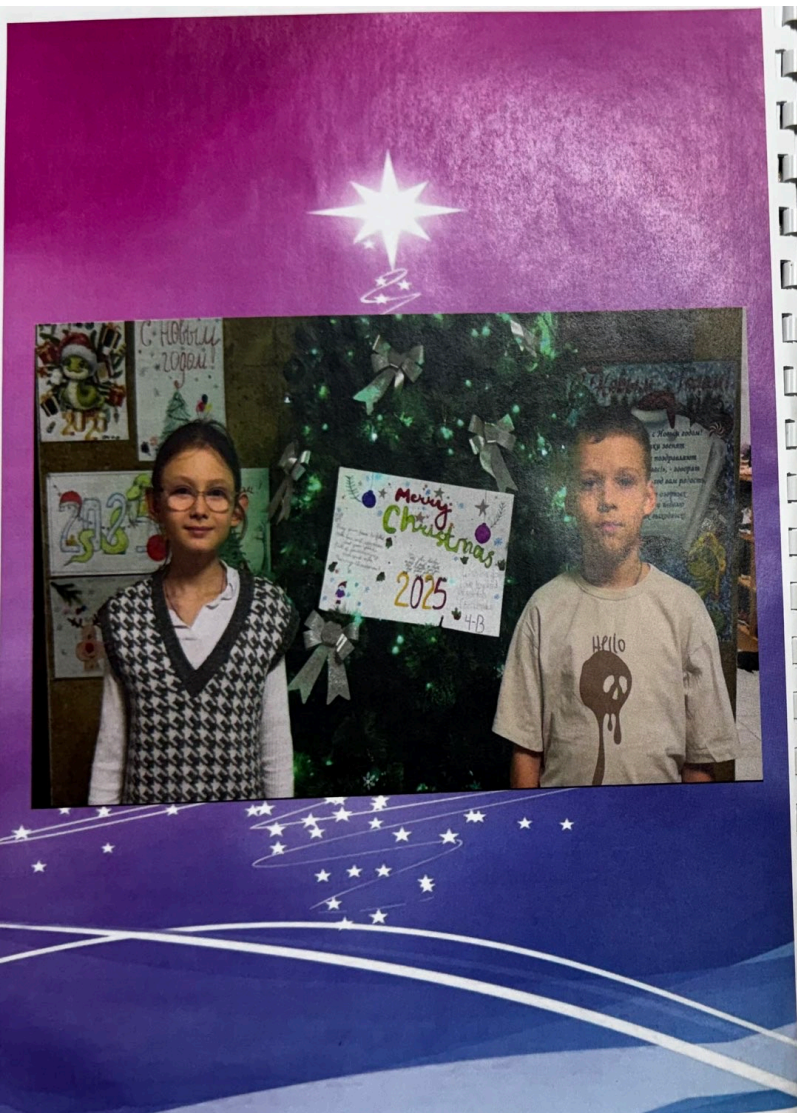
